Friends,

A clergy colleague asked me, "How's it feel to be back in your old church?" I answered, "The church is doing well and I'm having a great time."

Both responses are true. It does my heart good to see the church doing well. I continue to meet with various councils, committees, and the session. Positive things are happening! Church leadership is determined to proceed forth with a robust ministry during this time between pastors. To that end, important news is unfolding in March:

- The Session has called a congregational meeting for March 10 to hear a report from the church's nominating committee and to elect a Pulpit Nominating Committee (PNC) who will carry out the search for a new senior pastor. At the congregational meeting, a slate of names will be presented, placed in nomination, and voted upon.
- The Session heard from the interim search committee the progress of their work. There are some necessary procedural steps that are in process. If all goes well, I believe the Session will be making an announcement about a permanent interim pastor sometime in March.

- The Session appointed a Transition Team whose purpose is to ensure that the mission and ministry of the church is being fulfilled during the transition period and to ensure that the congregation is being informed about the work of the church, including information surrounding the process of calling a new senior pastor. This team will work with the Session, the interim pastor, and Elizabeth, our covenant associate pastor.
- The Session, understanding that now is the time to make decisions about the manse, appointed a Manse Committee to evaluate the current condition of the manse and to bring forth (1) a detailed description of minimal necessary repairs with cost estimates and (2) a detailed description of a plan to renovate the manse with cost estimates.

During Lent, we are heading toward Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter. Lent is a time for us to take stock of our spiritual life and refocus our heart, mind, and soul toward Jesus, our Christ.

As the month of March begins, we find ourselves deep into this season of Lent: a time of penitence and repentance, all with the promise of Easter on the horizon. One of the spiritual practices of Lent is self-reflection, intentional times when one may stop and take a moment to consider not only who they are, but who's they are. It is the practice of being intentional with our reading of scripture, our

practice of hospitality, and our time spent in devotion. It seems most appropriate then, that during this time of year, our 6th and 7th graders have begun the process of discerning what they believe so that they may be ready to present their personal statement of faith before the session as they are confirmed into the church. It is always a joy of mine to discuss the whole idea of what we believe. I discover something new about my own beliefs every time I take part in such a discussion and it is an honor to be able to do so with our young people. While it is good to slow down and focus on a spiritual practice, it is also good to engage in all the ministries that the church has to offer. And we offer a lot!

Here's what to look forward to this month:

Storytime with the Littles: Preschool

We will meet for a Bible lesson and craft for 3 Sundays this month (3/3, 3/10, and 3/17) at 5:15 pm. We meet in the first preschool room on the right as you enter from the parking lot or in the library.

Bible Club: K-5th Grade

We will meet for a Bible Lesson focused on a different word for Lent, Handbells/chimes, and choir at 5:15 pm for 3 Sundays this month (3/3, 3/10, and 3/17).

On Sunday, March 3rd, our Bible Club kids will sing and play handbells/chimes during the worship service. Kids need to be in the sanctuary that morning at 9:30 am to rehearse.

Confirmation: 6th and 7th Grade

Our confirmands have begun writing their own statements of faith. We will meet for 2 more Sundays (3/3 and 3/10) at 5:15 pm as we continue to talk

about what we believe. Confirmands will meet with their elder mentors this month and will work with me as they finish their statements.

On March 17th, the session will convene that morning at 8:30 am to have breakfast and hear each confirmand present their statement of faith.

After Easter, the youth will start Youth Sunday planning, which is scheduled for Sunday, April 21st.

High School Youth: 8th-12th Grade

We meet 3 Sundays this month (3/3, 3/10, and 3/17) at 5:15 pm in the youth room. We'll fellowship and have a discussion around one of the 10 commandments on 3/3 and 3/10. On 3/17, we'll play games. After Easter, the youth will focus on planning for Youth Sunday, which is scheduled for Sunday, April 21st.

Holy Week Events for Children:

Palm Sunday Worship, 3/24 Children from PreK up through 5th grade will process into worship waving palms and will sing Hosanna.

Egg Hunt, 3/24, 3-4:30 pm

Children from PreK up through 5th grade will gather at the church to hear the Easter Story, enjoy a snack, and of course, go on an egg hunt. Everyone who hunts for eggs will receive their own bag of Easter treats. Registration begins at 2:45 pm in the fellowship hall.

Sunday, March 24th Palm Sunday


K-5 Kids will bring in the palms during the Introit. The choir will perform a powerful new anthem, "Mercy" with Mia Alvarez as the soloist.
