## How to Make a Disciple

In Jesus' last words in the Gospel of Matthew, he gives his disciples their new mission statement: " 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,

baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

This, when it comes down to it, is the purpose of the church. When you strip away all the pomp and circumstance, the choirs and columbariums, the summer youth trips, and the DUMA food pantry, this is what you are left with. We are an institution, a community of people that exists to make disciples. And by making disciples, we don't just mean out of others who currently stand on the outside of the church that we hope to bring in. We mean to make disciples out of *each* other and to be continuously made into disciples ourselves.

Starting on Rally Day, we're going to be kicking off a new sermon series where we're going to take a hard look at not only what it means to make a disciple but also what it means to be made into one. The making of a disciple is at once the simplest and most complicated endeavor of life. In Jesus' mission statement for the church, he lays out three basic steps:

- 1. Baptize. Pour water over the head of a new disciple in the name of the trinitarian God, letting the water signify and seal the promise of love and mercy of God poured out for them in Christ Jesus.
- 2. Teach. The disciple is a constant learner because when it comes to the love and mercy of God, there is always more to learn. We must study the things the one who loves us would have us do with the mercy we have been given.
- 3. Remember. As we go out striving to do the things Christ would have us do for him, we must be continuously reminded of the things Christ has done for us. Jesus, of course, told us *exactly* how to remember him: as bread and wine, as food, always feeding and sustaining us for the journey ahead.

A disciple, I hope we will come to see, is not just a thing you are but a thing you are always becoming. There is no clear boundary on this side of paradise where one becomes a *finished* disciple, and in fact, it's not always clear that the making of a disciple is linear. But whatever path the journey of discipleship takes, we are not meant to make the journey alone.

I hope you'll come to be made into a disciple with us!



### Fall 2023!

While it's still crazy hot outside, we're looking forward to this Fall and all the ways we are called to learn about God and our call to be disciples. We kick everything off on Rally Day. Here's a rundown of

what to expect:

### Sunday, September 10th: Rally Day

- 8:30 am—Men's Breakfast in the Fellowship Hall

- 9:30 am—Sunday school

-<u>New Adult Class</u>: Bible Basics studying 1 Corinthians. We will have a rotating group of amazing teachers (along with Pastor Howard and myself). We'll meet in the parlor.

-<u>Covenant Class</u>: Our ongoing adult class uses "The Present Word" curriculum and they meet in the library.

-<u>Children's Sunday school</u>: Each Sunday, kids K-5th will learn a Bible story and color and discuss the story. They meet in the corner classroom.

10:30 am—Worship in the sanctuary. We'll take time in the service to highlight all the upcoming children, youth, and adult education opportunities.
11:30 am—Parent meeting in the sanctuary. I will go over Fall plans for children and youth.

The following Sunday we will officially start back Storytime, Bible Club, Confirmation, and Youth Fellowship. Here are some details on what Sunday night will look like:

### Sunday, September 17th:

**Storytime with the Littles**: 5:15-6 p.m., in the small preschool room across the hall from the library

-Children 3-4 years old will meet every Sunday night to hear a Bible story, do a fun craft, and learn more about the church and their faith. 4-year-olds may be dropped off, but we ask a parent to accompany any 3-year-olds.

### Bible Club: 5:15 pm-6:30 pm

Bible Club is going to be a bit different this year. We have a large group of kids

(yay!), so we have divided them up into 3 groups roughly based on age. Each group will rotate through 3 stations:

- 1. Choir in the choir room led by Kristen Anderson
- 2. Handbells upstairs led by Dena Bradham
- 3. Bible Study in the Corner Classroom led by Karen Parker

When children arrive on Sunday evening, they will be told which group they are in. Each group will have a name, Faith, Hope, or Love.

### Confirmation: 5:15 pm-6:30 pm

Our 6th and 7th graders will meet upstairs in the Middle School room. This year, confirmation will be focusing on the lessons we may glean from the 10 Commandments. Pastor Howard has sent out important information concerning Confirmation this year and I am excited to welcome a new class of young people into our membership!

### Youth Fellowship: 5:15 pm-6:30 pm

Our Senior High youth, including our 8th graders, will be following a study of the 10 Commandments as well. Pastor Howard and our youth advisors have an incredible season of study planned.

### We Take Turns...

I mean, people who are sensible and reasonable, that is. We take turns. We adhere to this pattern of one and then the other. It's a procedure of operation for almost everything. (Admittedly, there's

always that kid that skips to the front of the line, to all the jeers of the ones standing compliantly in line.) But, generally, the system of waiting and then not waiting is accepted.

Once you have had your turn at bat, whether it's a homeroom or a strikeout, you inevitably head back to the dugout to wait for your next turn. For an appointed number of innings, you get multiple turns at bat even if your last trip up was a total embarrassment.

Life seems to progress in a similar pattern. At some point, we all take a turn with joy. We take a turn with sorrow. We take a turn with success and a turn with failure. We take a turn at community and hurried frenzy. And there is usually a turn with loneliness and the un-exciting.

Ultimately, we take a turn with life and a turn with death. No matter how stellar we have lived, we have a turn with the final breath of it all. From Solomon (Ecc. 3:1) to the Beatles, it seems that everything will in fact, turn, turn, and then turn again.

### "I will sing unto the LORD as long as I live: I will sing praise to my God while I have my being." (Psalm 104:33)

While it's my turn to live, writes the Psalmist, I will sing praises to my God. This implies that there will be a time when he cannot sing. The "being part" will expire. There is a sense of urgency to sing now, to praise Him now while the turn at being alive is still in play.

For sooner than expected, it will be someone else's turn to sing, to swing the bat, to live a life of praise. If you've been waiting for the right time to do that thing that you have always wanted to do, assume that it is your turn now. You have your being, it's your turn, then, to live a life of praise and thanksgiving to the Lord. It's your turn to sing.

## **August Session Highlights**

Our Session met on August 21st, 2023. Some important highlights and decisions from this meeting include:

- 1. The Session approved a grant from our grant fund for a youth scholarship to the Massanetta Middle School Conference.
- 2. The Session reviewed and discussed the rising costs of Massanetta & Montreat. There will be a special fundraiser held on September 24th to help cover these costs, where the youth will share their experiences at the Conferences during lunch after church.
- 3. The Session voted to increase the number of elders serving on our Session from 12 to 15, with five elders in each class. The 2023-24 nominating committee has been instructed to fill the newly created vacancies in each class.
- 4. The Session reviewed the bylaws and policies of our Endowment, which restrict the use of funds from our endowment up to \$500,000. Currently, our Endowment sits at over \$760,000.
